So far this fall, activities have included a nature cruise aboard the Fripper II to explore local waterways and flyways, "Breakfast with the Birds" to observe and photograph the multitudes of resident shorebirds and migrants, and a guided "Tree Walk" through Beaufort's historic "Old Point" district.

As October drew to a close, the club hosted well-known nature educator and TV personality Tony Mills in the Fripp Community Centre, as he presented a fascinating, fun program highlighting our varied local habitats and their reptilian, amphibian, and mammalian inhabitants. This event was absolutely free, open to all, and featured a "meet 'n' greet" social hour with potluck snacks before Tony's program. As usual, Tony was accompanied by a strong supporting cast of "critter companions," wildlife that's all around us, which we can experience simply by taking a closer look at our surroundings.

Fripp Audubon will emphasize birding through the holidays. November 17th will mark our third bird identification workshop, focusing on birds commonly found at Fripp feeders. The Christmas bird count follows on December 17th.
